





Olympic Hills Draft Home Zone Project Survey

Background

A Home Zone is a community driven traffic calming program that aims to increase walkability and liviability within a neighborhood.

The Olympic Hills Home Zone began in August of 2022 with four community walks across the neighborhood. Over 50 neighbors shared their concerns and ideas with Seattle Department of Transportation (SDOT) staff. These comments were logged and can be viewed in an interactive map on the Home Zone website: (OH URL HERE).

Following the walks, a steering committee of Olympic Hills residents was formed. The steering committee and SDOT staff worked together to create a Draft Home Zone Map and a list of priority projects for the neighborhood.

Collaboration

Home Zone staff have worked closely with other SDOT teams and City of Seattle agencies to bring additional improvements to Olympic Hills.

The Home Zone team has collaborated with the Neighborhood Greenways Program to better connect Olympic Hills to the regional bike network, plant trees, and improve drainage. Projects Include:

- 1. Neighborhood Greenway: NE 135th Street from 15th Ave NE to Lake City Way NE
- 2. Healthy Street: 27th Ave NE from NE 127th St to NF 140th St
- 3. Little Brook Park Permanent Healthy Street and Plaza

Collaborations have also included partnering with Seattle Public Utilities (SPU) to reduce pollution, plant trees, and create new and improved space for people walking, biking, and rolling through the neighborhood.

The Olympic Hills Home Zone will also partner with the Safe Routes to School Program. This will enable greater investment in getting kids and families safely to and from school. These projects will likely focus on pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements within the vicinity of Olympic Hills Elementary School.

Home Zone Funding

There is \$200,000 in the Home Zone Program to fund the following projects:

- 1. 20th Ave traffic calming and ditch maintenance: \$50,000
- Brockman Pl speed humps: \$60,000
- 3. NE 137th St walkway: \$50,000
- 4. 23rd Ave pedestrian improvements: \$40,000
- 5. Thornton Creek Crossing Concept: \$20,000
- 19th Ave and Brockman Pl intersection improvements: \$20,000
- 7. 143rd St intersection improvements: \$30,000
- 8. NE 133rd Unopend Right of Way asphalt pathway: \$60,000






