
Home Zone: Co-Creating Seattle's Future

- Home Zones were advocated by the community due to lack of sidewalks – 500 years before alternative sidewalks will be constructed on all of Seattle streets.
- Reconnect West Seattle
 - South Park (constructed)
 - Georgetown (constructed)
 - Highland Park (constructed)
- North End
 - Olympic Hills/Lake City (plan development)
 - Aurora Licton Urban Village (plan development)
- South End
 - New Holly/Othello (plan finalized)
 - Rainier View (plan development)







Rainier View Home Zone


Rainier View Draft Home Zone - Revision 5





Projects Coming in 2023


- Alternative Walkways:
 - Luther Ave S
 - S Avon St
 - 53rd Ave S
- Signs near existing speed humps
- Painted and post at 55th Ave S and S Fountain St
- Potential Dedicated Pedestrian Space on S Avon St



Alternative Walkways


Outreach to Property Owners

- Ensure property owners understand parking changes
- Determine landscaping preferences
- Determine desire for additional roadside swales
- Determine support rate
 - We would like 60% approval
- Streets in 2023:
 - Luther Ave S
 - S Avon St (from Beacon Ave S to 53rd Ave S)
 - 53rd Ave S



Dedicated Pedestrian Space (Potentially 2023)

- •S Avon Street (from 53rd to 56th Ave S)
 - Ensure property owners understand parking changes
 - Determine landscaping preferences
 - Determine desire for additional roadside swales
 - Determine support rate
 - We would like 60% approval



Coordinating with Other Programs

- Rainier View started with \$200k in Home Zone Funding and \$500k for alternative Walkways on:
 - 56th Ave S
 - S Luther St
- Additional \$1.5 M from Safe Routes to School and Pedestrian Master Plan for:
 - Speed Cushions on Beacon and Bangor
 - Intersection Improvement at Beacon and Leo
 - Rapid Flashing Beacon at School Crosswalk
 - Dedicated Pedestrian Space on S Avon St
 - Alternative Walkway on S Leo St (Partial)
- Additional \$500k Sidewalk funding from Council
 - Alternative Walkways on S Avon and 53rd Ave S
 - Alternative Walkway on S Leo St (Partial)



Questions regarding SRTS Funding

- Preference for Beacon Ave Improvements:
 - \$500 K for crossing improvements at 56th
 - Wider planting areas
- •OR
- Preference for Dedicated Pedestrian Space



Questions regarding HZ Funding

- Development of Open Space Options:
 - Option 1: Seattle City Light ROW
 - Option 2: 56th Ave S
 - Option 3: S Wallace St
- OR
- Dedicated Pedestrian Space
- OR
- School community project
 - Art on fence
 - Community kitchen
 - Open space community space on school property



Next Steps

- SDOT will revise draft home zone map based on feedback
- Prepare outreach material to get neighborhood input on home zone plan
- Determine outreach strategies with steering committee and PTSA
 - Future meetings to be scheduled
- Once home zone plan is finalized, create map of desired projects that do not have funding
