### **Curbspace Changes in Uptown: Update**

SDOT collaborated with the Uptown community to design a curbside management plan to support access for residents, businesses, and visitors and prevent gridlock.

• Over 600 people engaged in the creation of this plan over many months and influenced the outcome.


#### GOAL: Prioritize access for businesses, residents and visitors in a quickly growing Urban Center

- Expand Restricted Parking Zone (RPZ) 13 and paid parking as shown in orange and blue shaded areas on map (next slide).
- Redesign blocks to optimize commercial and passenger loading needs.
- Include designated disabled parking spaces where possible, likely at the end of blocks.

#### **GOAL:** Discourage Arena event goers from using on-street parking

- Implement on-street event parking rates in all paid parking locations shown on the map during Arena events anticipating 10,000 or more attendees.
- Present event rate legislation to City Council (Transportation and Utilities Committee-June 16?)



- Expect construction noise, some weekend work

#### What to expect during construction

Typical work hours will be Monday through Friday 7 AM to 3:30 PM with possible weekend work.

Businesses, residents, and people traveling through the area may experience:

- Noise, vibrations, dust, and debris
- Driveway impacts
- Street and/or lane closures
- Large machinery and truck activity
- Construction staging and parking impacts near the construction sites
- Crosswalk and sidewalk closures, and detours for people walking and biking


Business, resident, and ADA access will be maintained as well as access to the Thomas St Pedestrian Overpass.




