- No reported issues with weekly tests
- Monitoring siren performance on site

# **Project goals**

- Replace and improve outdated siren and system components
- Add redundancy, resiliency, and reliability
- Add digital highway message signs and static evacuation route signs
- Listen and respond to community needs and suggestions
  - $\circ$  Add more sirens
  - $\circ~$  Add new digital highway message
  - $\,\circ\,$  Add new static evacuation route signs





### **Actions since June 15 Council meeting**

- June 30 online community meeting (<u>seattle.gov/utilities/toltsirenproject</u>)
- July 2 meeting with Carnation City Planner and leadership re: siren in River's Edge Park
- Site visits with siren vendor (June 21, June 25, July 7)
- Environmental/permitting:
  - Initial applications submitted to Federal Communications Commission
  - Coordination with King County, WSDOT, City of Carnation, Fire District, School District
- Continuing process to hire siren and microwave vendors
- Reviewing and integrating design comments
- Working toward final design
- Land surveys to support siren design and permitting


## Siren and signage improvements

- Replacing 8 sirens 4 outdoor and 4 indoor
- Moving one outdoor siren and adding one siren in east Carnation
- Adding later in the project:
  - 2 outdoor and 1 indoor siren
  - 6 digital highway message signs
  - Static evacuation route signs along designated evacuation routes

- **B** Tolt River Rd NE & NE 69<sup>th</sup> St
- C Tolt River Rd NE (5000 block)
- D Entwistle St & Milwaukee St
- Carnation Elementary School
- F Riverview School District Transportation Center
- G Tolt Middle School
- **H** Eastside Fire & Rescue Station 85
- River's Edge Park vicinity
- **I** Riverview Learning Center
- K SR 203 & NE 60<sup>th</sup> St
- L Tolt-MacDonald Park





# Adding two types of signs

#### Digital highway message sign example

- Tells people to evacuate in a dam break
- Brief, large text for drivers
- Pre-programmable




#### **Static evacuation sign example**

- Marks evacuation route
- Not digital or programmable

#### **Next steps**

- Continue siren replacement project
  - Integrate design comments
  - Develop final design, with siren and microwave systems vendors
  - NEPA environmental review critical path for FCC permitting
  - $\circ~$  Land use permits with King County, WSDOT, and City of Carnation
- Continue design for other project components
- Next Council update 8/17
- Next community meeting late summer/early fall
- Participate in September 25 annual evacuation drill
