



Seattle Public Utilities Water System Synopsis as of September 8, 2020




Little precipitation was recorded in the Cedar River and South Fork Tolt River Watersheds over the past week.







The average snow accumulation across the sites that we monitor is estimated to be about 0.0 inches snow water equivalent which is equal to the long term median for this time of the year.



Water use over the past week averaged about 161 million gallons per day (mgd), which is greater than the 148 mgd used during the same period over the years 2010-2019.

Note: WY = Water Year, which is defined as the 12-month period October 1, for any given year through September 30 of the following year. The water year is designated by the calendar year in which it ends. Thus, the year ending September 30, 2020 is called water year 2020 (WY 2020). Long-term water consumption data uses the most recent 10-years of data in order to better capture recent reductions in demand due to SPU's conservation program efforts.
